
Purpose

Assessments

- Bethel uses a combination of standard and nonstandard measures to monitor our impact on students' learning
- Teachers create curriculum-based measures to assess students' mastery of the standards
- Our teachers use standardized measures, such as the NWEA's Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) and the PSAT to assess student learning and growth




- Teacher-created assessments

Scientifically Research-Based Interventions (SRBI)

The SRBI framework has three "tiers." Each tier provides specific types and degrees of student support within the school setting.



Additional Support

Goal~ Accelerate the learning of students to move closer to or reach grade level standards

- Trained literacy and math specialists work collaboratively with core teachers
 - o Interventionists also work with our students under the direction of our specialists
- Pull out and/or push in models are used at the elementary level dependent on needs
- Classroom model at the secondary level
- Targeted instruction based on specific needs and aligned to standards & classroom instruction
- Progress monitoring- biweekly
- Monitor learning and adjust instruction as needed
- Communication with parents
